- The congregation and your friends and neighbors as well are invited to a meeting about advocacy around issues of hunger and food insecurity on Tuesday, January 14 from 10:00 to 11:30 in the Fellowship Hall. Cathy and Felipe Salinas, along with the Regional Director of Bread for the World, will provide information on current federal and state legislative measures dealing with food issues. Statistics about food insecurity in the RGV are alarming, but we can work together to improve the situation. This meeting will provide the opportunity to:
  - o review the Texas Food Policy Roundtable legislative agenda at the state level;
  - o review Bread for the World's *Nourish Our Future* agenda at the federal level;
  - o share details about upcoming virtual advocacy days;

- A Note from Dana Friedman, FPC Treasurer, to clear up some confusion on the receipts and expenditures shown in the Monday Message and in the Sunday Bulletin The numbers in the Financial Report show a significant deficit, but the church's current situation is actually much less dire. FPC has some invested funds given to us by the Bill Wilson family and others. We are able to draw down from these investments to supplement our receipts. For 2024, the Session approved withdrawing \$60,000 from our investments; however, over the course of the year increases in our accounts has been greater than withdrawals, so our investment accounts remain strong. The distributions from our investments to the general fund is not reflected in the numbers in the Monday Message and Sunday Bulletin. Also this year we received some life insurance and other money from Henry McElmurrays's estate and paid a few final bills of his. The net receipts have not yet been included in the numbers in the Monday Message and Sunday Bulletin. On the third day, there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. <sup>2</sup> Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. <sup>3</sup> When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." <sup>4</sup> And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." <sup>5</sup> His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." <sup>6</sup> Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. <sup>7</sup> Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. <sup>8</sup> He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. <sup>9</sup> When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom <sup>10</sup> and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." <sup>11</sup> Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
